


Becoming a member of the Bioenergy Association

What is the Bioenergy Association?

The Bioenergy Association is a membership-based sector association established to assist members expand their business activities related to the production and use of bioenergy and biofuels. The Association principally covers the New Zealand, Australian and South Pacific bioenergy markets for liquid, gaseous and solid biofuels. The Association has over 2600 members, associates, and followers. This document sets out the procedures for becoming a member, or maintaining membership, and outlines the information required that would assist Association staff to maximise the value you get from membership.

Information on why you should be a member of the Association is set out in membership benefits on the



website <u>www.bioenergy.org.nz/benefits-of-membership</u>. Which also sets out the services you can expect as a member. A key benefit of membership is how we, as an independent organisation, work with you to promote your interests within the sector and to the general public. We work with you on a confidential basis, while at the same time providing advocacy of generic information to Government and the public, and leading collaborative research projects of interest to all members. Our aim is to ensure that the members of the Association are recognised as delivering solutions using best practice and based on the most up-to-date knowledge and experience. We have a suite of quality assurance schemes which distinguish members, who are experts in their topics, from those who may have uncertain knowledge and experience.

The Association recommends that to ensure potential bioenergy users engage practitioners who have demonstrated that they work at best practice, they should only purchase products or services from Association accredited members.

- If you are an investor business the Association can work with you on a confidential basis to provide you with market-related information and assist with unpublished information required to build an investment business case. The association also provides best practice technical guides and can provide guidance on risk management options.
- For consultants, service providers and equipment suppliers the association can actively promote your business and there are specific membership levels that assist with profiling your products and services, brand placement and the selling of your products or skills. The association also provides facilities for promoting your capabilities, services or products. Members obtain free confidential advice from the Association staff on matters affecting their bioenergy business.

- The association can assist applications by members for **research or project development funding** by providing independent support.
- For policy advisers the association can provide, on a neutral confidential basis, information on market opportunities and barriers, market capabilities and assist with programme or regulation development.

The association also undertakes activities for the collective good of all members through advocacy of bioenergy and biofuels to potential investors, regulators and the public generally.

The Bioenergy Association is organised into three Interest Groups each pursuing a specific bioenergy or biofuels topic. (Gaseous, solid and liquid biofuels) These Interest Groups are the power houses of the association where most topic-based activities are developed and implemented. The Interest groups also oversee the determination of best practice. Members may have free participation in one or more Interest Groups according to their business interests and membership level.

The members who obtain the best value from their membership are those who participate actively in association activities and drive policies and actions for their own business interests, and for the sector. A strong member-driven association will assist with advocacy to government, accessing media and ensuring that the government policies and regulations are in the best interests of members. The funds necessary to run the association and to undertake projects come principally from membership fees so a strong and healthy membership will assist provide funding for collective action. From time to time some funding is sourced from government agencies for specific tasks where the government and sector interests align.

Applying for membership

There are no criteria other than the payment of a membership fee for anyone to join the Bioenergy Association. However, members are expected to abide to the Association's <u>Code of Conduct</u>. The Membership Application Form - <u>www.bioenergy.org.nz/resource/banz-membership-application-form</u> is available on the website <u>www.bioenergy.org.nz</u>. Each member must nominate a representative for their membership.

Platinum, Gold, Silver and Bronze membership cover any employees of the member regardless of location and country.

A member may have an unlimited number of staff listed under the member's membership. The member's representative should provide email addresses of any staff they wish to be listed to receive communications from the association.

Bioenergy Association members' only information

The Association managed websites are designed for promoting bioenergy to the public and in particular to those with potential bioenergy investment opportunities as well as for members. In general, the information on the open parts of the website in the Bioenergy Knowledge Centre <u>www.bioenergy.org.nz/bioenergy-knowledge-centre</u> is for the public who have limited amounts of detailed information in the form of abstracts. The more valuable publications are available free by password access to members. Non-members may ask for any document and an administration fee may be charged. To obtain access to the Members' Only area you should contact <u>admin@bioenergy.org.nz</u>.

Professional standards and complaints.

The Bioenergy Association assists its members to be working at the highest levels of best practice. It provides knowledge and experience education by sharing through its webinar programme and publication of best practice Technical Guides.

The association's focus on professionalism is supported by the members' Code of Conduct and its quality assurance schemes are overseen by a <u>Professional Standards and Complaints Committee</u>. The Committee has oversight of members professional conduct and provides support to the accreditation schemes. The professional standards processes are based on assisting members resolve any issues or complaints, in the first instance, with a formal process to back this up if necessary.

In joining the Association Members agree to abide by its <u>Code of Conduct</u>

Quality assurance schemes available to members are:

- <u>Accredited Solid Biofuel Supplier</u>
- Digestate Biofertiliser Producer
- <u>Registered Wood Energy Adviser</u>
- <u>Registered Gaseous Biofuels Advisor</u>

The Association recommends that only Registered Advisers should be engaged and that solid biofuel and digestate biofertiliser should only be purchased from accredited suppliers/producers.

The Registered Advisers are members who have demonstrated to a third party that they have the appropriate knowledge and experience or produce a bioproduct covered by their quality assurance processes.

Bioenergy Association membership levels and fees

The levels of membership are based on the amount and nature of the assistance sought. Clearly Platinum, Gold and Silver level members want a greater amount of assistance than Bronze level members. Bronze level membership is for those wishing to keep an eye on the sector and be kept up to date with market knowledge. Bronze level members obtain minimal support and promotion.

Members selling products and services should be at a Platinum, Gold or Silver membership level. There are different levels of support and promotion according to the level of membership. For example, Gold and Platinum members can schedule a proactive monthly meeting with the Association Executive Officer to discuss opportunities which will progress the member's commercial interests. '

The Bioenergy Association has special Interest Groups that members may join free of charge subject to membership level. Each Interest Group has a Steering Committee which manages activities relevant to each Interest Group. Each member may have a representative on the relevant Interest Group Steering Committee.

Ten percent of membership fees are allocated to advocacy activities on behalf of members, and ten percent of membership fees are allocated to research and market development projects. The priorities for the use of these funds are determined by the respective Interest Group Steering Committees.

Each member has an opportunity to list a profile of their products and services which is attached to their <u>listing</u> as a bioenergy expert. The application form provides a template on the profile content applicable to each of the membership levels. (Examples of listings are shown in this document.) Members with an Individual level membership are not listed as an expert, and bronze level members are limited to the amount of content they may have in their profile.

As a Guide to the level of membership we would expect you to pay:

• Platinum Member \$7,500 plus GST

This membership level is for those who want to participate in shaping the sector to provide the best outcomes and seriously influence Government policy development, the strategic activities of the Association, and obtain maximum promotion of their products and services.

• Gold Member \$5,500 plus GST

This membership level is for the leaders in the sector and for companies seeking significant assistance from association staff or wanting maximum market exposure. At this level you get near instant access to, and assistance from, the executive officer. May be a user with multi-site bioenergy activities wanting continuing professional development of staff on bioenergy best practice.

¹ The criteria for individual membership is limited to individuals who have a personal and not a commercial interest in bioenergy and biofuels; may be retired or not actively working in the sector for income, may be considering working in the sector but are currently not actively employed or gaining income from the sector.

• Silver Member \$2,200 plus GST

The membership level for serious players in the New Zealand bioenergy sector and for companies seeking significant assistance from association staff or wanting maximum market exposure. Probably have more than 2 staff active in bioenergy matters or have significant interests in bioenergy. Have products and services where promotion is wanted.

• Bronze Member \$750 plus GST

The minimum level for any company that is serious about being a player in the New Zealand bioenergy sector. Probably have less than 2 staff active in bioenergy matters. Want networking and information gathering but do not have products and services for promotion. Probably a small bioenergy user eg single small boiler.

Individual / observer \$220 plus GST

This level of membership is for very small players in the sector and companies that are emerging into the sector as 'new entrants' and wish to gain information on the bioenergy market and upcoming Bioenergy Association activities by subscribing to the association Bioflash newsletter. This is the minimum service level with free access to the Bioenergy Knowledge Centre, webinars and member rates for attendance at Bioenergy Association events. This level is also for students, retired people and observers of the industry.

• Student \$80 plus GST

This level of membership is for students currently enrolled in education programmes who wish to be kept informed on the bioenergy market and upcoming Bioenergy Association activities by subscribing to the association Bioflash newsletter.

In return for your membership fees the association is able to provide a Free Advisory Service to the sector and to the Government. Without the income received from membership fees we have no voice.

Member assistance

Members have free and open access to discuss any bioenergy matter with Association staff (all discussions are on a confidential basis). Association staff have extensive knowledge and experience of the sector and can provide guidance to your bioenergy business. Access to staff is free (within limits).

Association staff often have unpublished information on the Oceania bioenergy sector

which could be shared to assist members investigating investment opportunities. Staff are available by phone or email. For new entrants to the bioenergy market this information can be very valuable and not available elsewhere.

The Bioenergy Association is a sector association so its primary focus is to assist the business aspirations of all its members equally, however, Gold and Platinum level members get priority with regard to member services so if you are serious about being involved in the bioenergy sector and wish to obtain significant assistance and support from association staff or seek profile, you should look to being in one of these membership categories. The Silver membership level is the membership level for





smaller or startup operators. An Individual / observer member essentially subscribes to the Bioflash newsletter and gets free access to webinars and member rights to Association events but not much else. However, they can access staff for free.

Promotion of member capabilities

All levels of member (excluding Individual / observer and student members) are listed on the Bioenergy Association website <u>www.bioenergy.org.nz/contact-expert</u>. (The Association considers that it is a collective of experts – not members). Through this listing and a range of capability directories on the specific topic websites members are able to promote their capabilities, services and products. This is a key member service and the association websites each get around a hundred and fifty visits a day, and have a high search ranking, so is very cheap internet advertising.

Bioenergy facilities directory

The Bioenergy Association also hosts the Bioenergy Facilities Directory www.bioenergyfacilities.org.nz which aims to list all facilities which are relevant to bioenergy in New Zealand, Australia and the Pacific and which members have been involved with during their development. It is a showcase of existing facilities but also a quick source of information on facilities of interest and where to get additional information. It also lists the capabilities of those who are associated with the investigation and construction of each facility. The Directory can be used to locate facilities on a NZ or Australian map (extendable to the world map) and can selectively filter searches to enable the user to find exactly what they want. All data is presented in a Facility Profile format which can be printed from the database. Members are encouraged to list their projects so as to demonstrate experience and capabilities. This is the place to



show off what you have done and why they should contact you. Listing is free for members.

Advertising

Advertising on websites and in the Bioflash newsletter is available on request, advertising rates and details can be found <u>here²</u>. *Platinum and Gold level members obtain some free advertising*.

Equipment catalogues

The Association currently has Equipment Catalogues on two of its specific topic websites <u>www.biogas.org.nz</u> | <u>www.usewoodfuel.org.nz</u>. Members get a number of free listings for the bioenergy equipment they sell according to their membership level. Additional listings in the catalogues are available for a <u>fee</u>. Non-members equipment is not listed.

Equipment listings will be presented through a series of topic categories in each catalogue, Table 2 shows the current category listings on the Biogas and Wood energy websites.

Listing on the Contact an Expert section of the website

Members (excluding Individual level members) obtain free listing on the 'Contact an Expert' page of the website <u>www.bioenergy.org.nz/contact-expert</u>. Member's details are also listed on the Interest Group website of their choice and according to their level of membership. The association profiles its members at every opportunity as this is one way of demonstrating the competence and capabilities of the industry. It also only promotes members by distinguishing the quality of performance of members from non-members. The format for listing is dependent on the level of membership.

Membership can be removed from those who do not comply with the <u>Code of Conduct</u>

Membership of the Association and compliance to it's Code of Conduct is a signal to the public that members are up-to-date with the bioenergy and biofuels market and relevant technologies, and undertake their work using best practice. The Association will remove membership from a member whom there is a significant complaint against. Members can display the membership decal on their own promotion material as a sign of pride and indication that they meet the highest standards for products and workmanship.

Profile attached to the Contact an Expert listing

Members (excluding Individual / observer and Student level categories) are given profile and made visible on Association's websites appropriate to their level of membership. The templates for listing are on the <u>Membership Application Form</u> and at the end of this information sheet. Bioenergy Association maintains its <u>www.bioenergy.org.nz</u> and three specific bioenergy topic websites –

<u>www.biogas.org.nz</u> | <u>www.liquidbiofuels.org.nz</u> and <u>www.usewoodfuel.org.nz</u>. Tables 3 and 4 below show the work categories which assist with searching.
